

Appendix D – May 2025

Damaged Tree Jubilee Green

I inspected the tree (T18 Norway Maple) on 23 April.

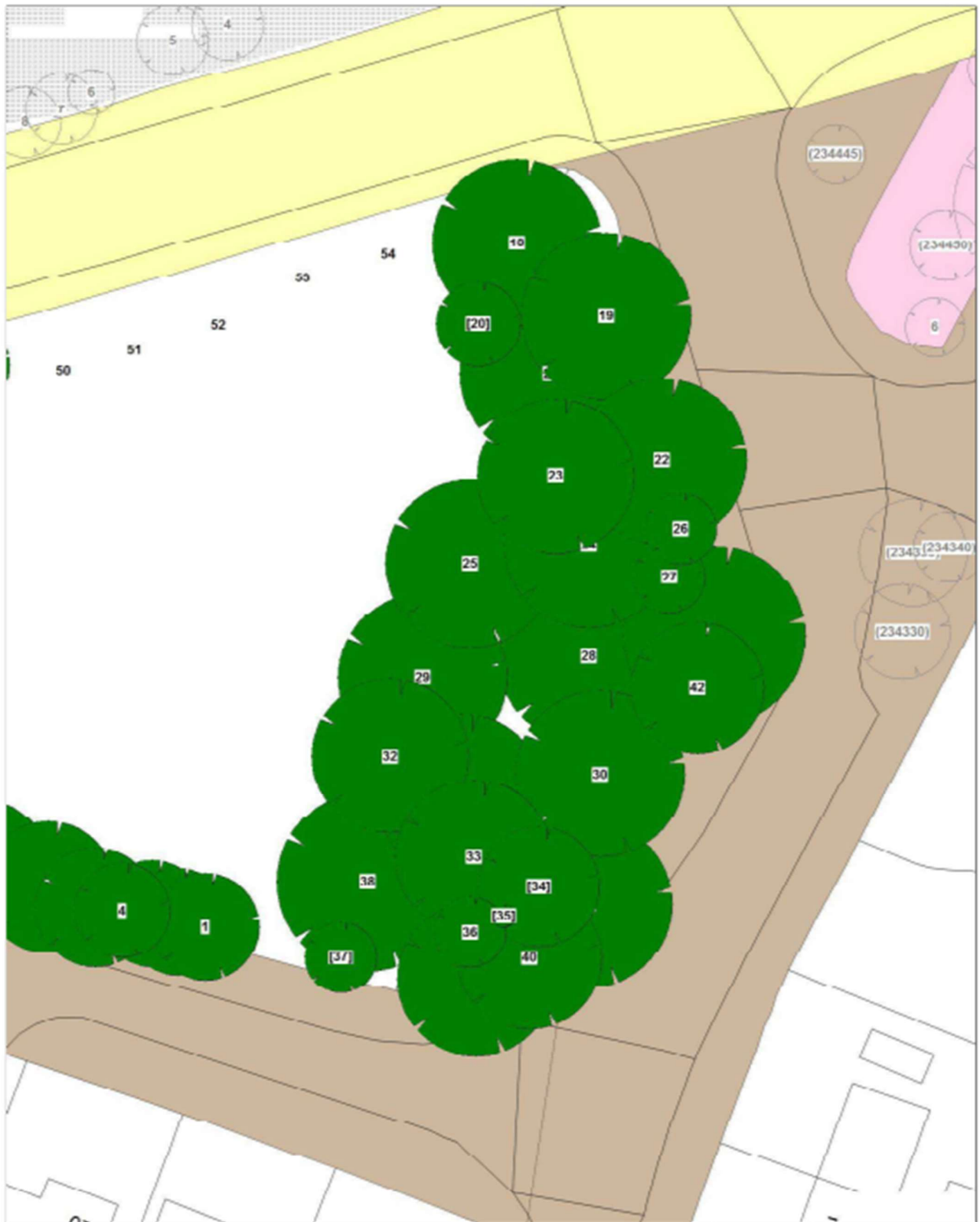
A large limb has fallen from the tree at its union with the main trunk, this has left a large tear wound on the remaining tree, to each side of the tear there are large branches that have had some of their support removed when the limb failed. Within the remaining canopy several large dead branches were visible. As the remaining limb has lost Approx. 50% of its supporting timber, I have listed below some option for remedial works to hopefully stabilize the remaining trees canopy. The first two options would retain the tree on site; however, it won't be the most aesthetically pleasing specimen until several years have passed and the canopy has started to reform.



1. Remove the two lowest branches and any dead wood and reduce the remaining canopy by 50%, Works Total £1343.00 +VAT if applicable. This would still leave the large tear wound that is likely to decay over time.
2. Remove the entire damaged limb and any dead wood, then reduce the remaining canopy by 50%, Works Total £1343.00 +VAT if applicable. This would leave a large pruning scar on the trunk that over time would struggle to fully heal.
3. Fell and stump grind. Felling Total £1133.00 +VAT if applicable. Grinding Total £436.00 +VAT if applicable.

The other option would be to do nothing; however, I believe that within a relatively short time frame the tree is likely to shed one or several of the affected branches around the tear wound.

The felling costs are based on the nearby picnic bench being removed before the works are undertaken, if this is not possible the works gang can move the bench on the day however no guarantee would be given for the bench structure .
